

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

A Ron Lowther Production


f you like History like I do, you will appreciate the enthusiasm and accuracy which local Author and Producer Ron Lowther puts into this project. He wants you to imagine what it would be like sitting in this tank, feeling the concussion of the shells as they are fired from the tank. The noise must be unimaginable. Mr. Lowther will take you back through history with the 756th Tanker training, and lead you to where and when this group ended up in World War II. There were a lot of firsts that the 756th accomplished, and what brings the story together are the Veterans' interviews showing the personalities and manner in which they dealt with the death and destruction of war. This was a highly decorated Battalion with two Medal of Honor winners.

Now let's get into Ron Lowther's project with information obtained from his book:

The **756th Tank Battalion Project** is a World War II documentary about experiencing the life and battles from inside the M4A3 Sherman medium tank. The story is based around the 756th Tank Battalion, tracing their path from North Africa to Germany and Austria. The Documentary will focus on informing the masses about the actions of the 756th, one of the elements that helped win the war.

There were millions of stories from World War II, but very few have ever been told. Before the United States became involved in World War II, the government felt an urgency to be best prepared for the inevitable. In part of that preparation, the military actually

debated whether to go into war with mounted Cavalry or armor. Yes it was real, and fortunately they made the right decision. Now armor build up was on the list and it needed to get started right away. There were select bases throughout the country to be the training grounds for tanker training. Fort Lewis, Washington was one of them and gave birth to what was to be the 756th Tank Battalion. The 756th was a bastardized tank battalion providing troop support,

truth to what the 756th had to endure, and the devastation they partook in and witnessed from war. These men helped save the Office in the Covert Electronic Surveillance Unit as in-house producer for the agency, and as a video forensics specialist handling retrieval and processing of digital video evidence. 
which mostly engaged in tank on tank battles. The 756th was also involved in tank on tank fights, but operated in smaller groups.



"The 15:17 To Paris" is the true story of three lifelong Sacramento best friends who thwarted a terrorist attack aboard the titular train. 

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Q: One of my favorite shows was "Orphan Black." Can you tell me more about the actress who played Delphine? — Bryan F., via email

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



Hollywood Exposed

ompared to the Harvey Weinstein scandal and ongoing #MeToo revelations, what's one to make of a Hollywood story exposing something as mundane as murder? Or even yet another closet homosexual?

When South Florida's most notable and prolific (of course, he's super talented!) playwright Michael McKeever first turned his unrelenting wit and skewering eye on the hidden workings of Tinseltown -- was it only a few years ago? -- he probably thought exposing an establishment macho actor's alternative sexual predilections was the worst that could happen to tank his career. Especially if said actor had been repeatedly typecast as a "man's man" action hero, out to save the world.

McKeever's Clark Gable Slept Here, now playing at Main Street Playhouse, is a perfectly-executed, and cast, dark farce that reveals how far Hollywood insiders everyone from agents to actors, hookers to hotel managers -- will stoop to turn their fantasies of

fame and fortune into reality. Or as real as anything gets in this make-believe town built on images that, like its earthquake-prone ground, are forever shifting. As star-launching dealmaker Jarrod "Hilly" Hilliard (portrayed with snide perfection by Clint Archambault) says in his final toast: "Here's to reality -- whichever one you choose ... All that matters is what's trending. And how many followers you have on Twitter."

But I'm putting the cart before the horse of a truly wild, bumpy, endlessly unpredictable ride. Like any good murder mystery, the play opens with the shock of an unexplained dead body. It's the night of the Golden Globes and the body is discovered in the fancy hotel penthouse bedroom of first-time nominee, Patrick Zane, who's off attending the awards ceremony with his wife. Meanwhile, a male prostitute lies prone in full bottom-up naked glory at the foot of Zane's bed, playing dead for about half the play's run -- an achievement in stillness flawlessly executed by Roderick Randall as Travis. By the way, you needn't worry about this actor's credits reading "backside exposed in play" as he does, in fact, later come to all-out, emotionally

charged, life ... at least for a little while.

And, like everyone in the room (representing a aamut of Hollywood-style aspirations), Travis is driven by a hidden, self-centered agenda. Zane's agent, Hilly, brags about how he's responsible for the actor's career-changing nomination, coming after years of cultivation just as he's reached his "expiration date of 46." When confronted with the possibility of Zane having real feelings he proclaims: "Patrick Zane is not a human being. He is a billion dollar industry." Adding, "The man is talent-free. Saving the world is all he knows how to do." As for the nomination, Hilly credits himself with having found the perfect movie role "smack in the middle of his wheelhouse ... and it's not a very big wheelhouse."

Hilly tells diffident hotel manager, Gage Holland (played with anxious bluster by Chris D'Angelo) to wait till he arrives before calling the police, but then refuses to report the dead body despite the manager's protestations. Gage's is the voice of conscience, but it's a perennially spineless one. He is eventually convinced to join in the cover up in order to uphold his hotel's sterling reputation, and not risk losing his beloved job.

Exhibiting no conscience whatsoever are the two female characters. First up is the, ahem, Spanishspeaking maid, Estella, who decides this is the perfect opportunity to score a bag of cocaine. When found out and actually witnessing a murder, she doesn't miss a beat in demanding a job as line producer for HBO in exchange for her silence. Marcela Paguaga brings bilingual brilliance and hilarity to her role. Whether describing the actions of an imaginary, limping dwarf or wailing prayers

> over the "dead" body, she left Miami's mostly bilingual audience falling out of their seats with laughter (and no, you don't need to speak Spanish to "get" it; her ultra-expressive body language will suffice).

> And now to the unlikely "clean up crew." A true femme fatal, Morgan Wright's (playing it super cool and cloying-when-necessary Sandi Stock) biggest regret is having to cut short her flirtation with Jon Hamm when called away from the Awards Ceremony to do Hilly this favor, though she's obviously in his debt. There's no question as to how far she'll go to keep the Patrick Zane brand intact. As the nonplussed Hilly explains: "This is Hollywood; of course she can make a corpse disappear."

> Even the title of the play -- described by director John Ferry as a "wickedly, unapologetically funny black comedy" -- could be more smoke and mirrors. Set in legendary Chateau Marmont's penthouse suite, it may or may not have been the site of Clark Gable's alluded-to homosexual trysts. But at least, in this story, the illicit sex is paid for and consensual. In a rare moment of honesty, Travis, the prostitute, admits he'd only loved

Zane in a "Hollywood sort of way." As for hooking up with a married man, he shrugs, saving: "I do a lot of married celebrities. The Scientologists alone would have me booked for the next five years."

If you find lines like these hilarious, you're sure to love a play that's peppered with wry, witty, and shocking-but-true observations about a makebelieve world that has thrived among us long before "fake news" became a meme. Clark Gable Slept Here pays homage to those original Masters of Deception whose stars we've worshipped ever since movies were invented. At times, aren't we all guilty of collusion with fantasies promoted by agents like Hilly, who sums up: "This is Hollywood. No one wants reality. We live and breathe illusion."



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

A Black History Month Tribute To Bill "Bojangles" Robinson... "Bojangles...Tappin' Up A Storm"

"Those who have no record of what their forebears have accomplished lose the inspiration which comes from the teaching of biography and history," wrote Carter G. Woodson, the father of Black History Month. Woodson could have been referring to Bill "Bojangles" Robinson!

When Sammy Davis, Jr., would come on stage... cock his hat... and sing "... I knew a man, Bojangles... and he danced for me," there was usually a palpable excitement among the audience. People loved the Jerry Jeff Walker song! Some remembered "Bojangles" dancing with Shirley Temple... Well... STOP THE MUSIC! That song is not about Bill "Bojangles" Robinson. He was not a kindly Negro who "... drinks a bit" and whose "... dog up and died." It's about a white man who Walker met in jail in New Orleans... In fact, at that time, jail cells... along with a lot of other places, were segregated. So, who was the 'real' "Bojangles"?

"I hate that song "*Mr. Bojangles.*" It drives me up the wall since it's not about him at all. He was never a bum in jail," Shirley Temple wrote in her autobiography – "*Child Star*". She and her 'Uncle Billy' tap-danced their way into the hearts of 250 million movie fans around the world. Some things bear repeating... 250 million people around the world in the 1930's!

"Bojangles ... Tappin' Up A Storm" is a multicultural history book that we have written... still looking for a dynamic Literary Agent to shop the book... that brings to life the "Golden Era of Entertainment" that spanned the first half of the 20th century, covering vaudeville – the black TOBA circuit and the white circuits, the early mass entertainment cinema from nickelodeon and peep shows to "two-reelers" followed by "feature" films; from Silent's to Talkies. The story chronicles the birth and growth of Broadway musicals and lavish Revues, the Cotton Club and the night-club era, radio and recording, with African-American comedian, tap dancer and philanthropist, Bill "Bojangles" Robinson as the central figure.

A man's life can often be surmised by his

funeral! The Reverend Adam Clayton Powell, Senior, told those gathered together at the Abyssinian Baptist Church at Bo's funeral, that "... Bill was a legend. He was a legend because he was ageless and race-less. Bill wasn't a credit to his race, meaning the Negro race, Bill was a credit to the human race. He was not a great Negro dancer, he was the world's greatest dancer."

Reverend Powell's eulogy was broadcast on the radio around the country, flags flew at half mast in New York City and all of the schools in Harlem closed in time to let the children join the estimated one million people who turned out to pay their respects on a cold, rainy November day. Some things bear repeating... one million people... the largest funeral in New York's history!

"The greatest casualty is being forgotten" is the Wounded Warriors Project trademark statement, which could aptly apply to Bill Robinson. All but lost to history, Robinson was one of the world's most charismatic super-stars of the 20th Century. Bill Robinson was more than a tap dancer, albeit "... the world's greatest tap dancer," he was a philanthropist who raised a reported \$100 million for charities, he co-owned the New York Black Yankees Baseball team when baseball games were the primary social activities in the African American communities throughout America, and he earned the equivalent of \$95,000 a week in 2017 dollars.

Robinson was the Honorary Mayor of Harlem and was a "Race Ambassador," who broke down racial barriers in his own unique way. His 60+ year career was even more miraculous, as he grew up, lived and succeeded in the racially divided "Jim Crow" era and was a "Favorite Son" in his hometown or Richmond, Virginia.

While we are still pitching our book – hope springs eternal – we wanted to share some snippets about "Uncle Billy," as Shirley Temple called Robinson; as a tribute to a great American and humanitarian during Black History Month! As Bill would say, "everything is copacetic!".

With the help of Bo's longtime Manager, Marty Forkins, Bill made the transition to Broadway, lavish revues on and off Broadway and starred in 14 movies, including the blockbuster hit, "**Stormy Weather"** – loosely based on Bo's life - with

NSU Art Museum Fort Lauderdale presents Midnight in Paris & New York: Scenes from the 1890s – 1930s, William Glackens and His Contemporaries. The exhibit runs from February 4th through October 18th. Featuring drawings, paintings and photographs by American and European artists along with distinctive architectural designs, furniture, glass, metalwork and silver, this new exhibition offers a fascinating glimpse into the rapidly changing society of the turn of the century and life in the new modern city. The Museum's Sunny Kaufman Senior Curator Barbara Buhler Lynes, Ph.D. curated the exhibition.

William J. Glackens (1870-1938) came of age as an artist in the 1890s, when he distinguished himself as one of America's most celebrated illustrators. He subsequently became known as an important and leading modernist artist for his lively, realistic depictions of modern life and an important advocate of modern art in America. The years of his creativity from the1890s to the 1930s were marked by dramatic social, political and technological changes that revolutionized the character of cities around the world, such as New York, where the Philadelphiaborn Glackens moved in 1896, and Paris, where he lived from 1895-96 and to which he returned many times.

Highlighted in the exhibition is NSU Art Museum's distinctive William J. Glackens art and archival collection, the largest holding of the artist's work in the world. Works on Ioan and from the museum's collection by Berenice Abbot, Eugène Atget, William Bradley, Brassaï, Daum, Edith Dimock, Emile Gallé, William J. 
