Protecting Our Children In Schools

he recent mass shooting in Parkland is very sad indeed. I can't even imagine how those parents feel. The only thing I can hope for is this kind of thing doesn't happen again. I know this: we must take action against this happening in the future. Our children deserve to have an education without this kind of tragedy in their future. Guns are not the problem; it's the person behind the gun that's the problem. This particular sick person was known as a problem child. He had many problems in schools, was kicked out of Marjory Stoneman Douglas High in Parkland and was diagnosed with an emotional and behavioral disorder. There were several calls into the FBI and the local police department. He should have been flagged as a person who has mental issues and not be allowed to buy a gun. This did not happen.

I will not be a Monday morning guarterback and belittle the FBI and the local police department. God knows they are dedicated people and put their lives on the line constantly. They surely didn't want this to happen. I only want to come up with a solution that will solve and prevent this from occurring in the future. As mentioned earlier, guns are not to be blamed, just like cars are not to be blamed when someone gets killed in a car crash. This is somehow missed by the left. They think "ban all guns" or "ban certain guns" and somehow the criminal will not kill because there was a new gun law passed. If you believe for a moment that a criminal cares about gun laws, I have some nice property in the swamps to sell you.

Let's talk a little about gun free zones. The **Gun-Free School Zones Act** came into effect in 1990 to make schools safe. Since at least two years, the district has had staff members who carry concealed weapons. Staff members who carry are required to practice at a shooting range once a month. Office and the Department of Public Safety. Parents say they feel very safe sending their kids to school with this type of preparedness. Let's face it, our children are the most precious people in our lives and they deserve the best protection we can give. In addition to arming those teachers who wish to be armed, we can put police sub stations at each school, which would give added protection. I believe that we do not have a shooting problem. What America has is a broken people problem. One of the many problems we have is the destruction of the family unit and the complete eradication of God from homes, schools, etc... Until we address the problem of broken families and people, mass murder and school shootings are going to continue, and as society continues to break down, they will happen with increasing frequency. We can only become aware if a student is having problems. Get them appropriate help, whether it is counseling or psychiatric help. There is a reason, after all, that mass shooters target schools and other "gun free zones:" It's because no one will be shooting back. Remember Columbine happened during the Clinton Gun ban. A mentally disturbed person or a criminal care a less about gun laws. They are going to break the law anyway. When I hear people saying let's ban guns, do they really think that will be the solution? **Don't** they realize that a criminal will get a gun no matter how many laws you pass? They will get them on the black market. The only person a new gun law effects is a law-abiding citizen, the people you don't have to worry about anyway. We need to make sure a mentally disturbed person cannot get a gun. Their name needs to be put on a national list so when they try to buy a gun, it comes up and denies their gun purchase.

Governor Scott has come up with some very good solutions for our state. Scott, a Republican, is submitting a plan to the GOP-controlled state legislature that includes raising the age on gun sales to 21, banning the sale of bump-stock attachments that enable rifles to rapid fire, and spending at least \$450 million on mental health and "hardening" schools with metal detectors, bullet-proof glass and other enhanced-security measures. I don't think making our schools prisons is the answer, but I do believe in being prepared for the event if a shooter, whether it's a student or Isis terrorist, comes to school to do damage. I believe an armed properly and trained teacher can keep them at bay until the police arrive. Remember, they are not expecting anyone to shoot back at them. Chicago, who has one of the highest if not the highest gun deaths in the country, also has the strictest gun laws. So more gun laws won't help.

Reports show that more people are killed with knives than rifles. The FBI Uniform Crime Report (UCR) for 2016 shows more than four times as many people were stabbed to death than were killed with rifles of any kind. And because the category of rifles covers every type of rifle, this means there would be an even greater divide between the number of people stabbed to death versus those shot to death with an AR-15 or similar rifle. According to FBI: UCR Table 12, there were approximately 374 people shot and killed with rifles of any kind. There were 1,604 people killed with "knives or cutting instruments." Table 12 also shows that more people were killed via the use of "hands, fists, feet, etc.," than were killed by rifles of any kind. In fact, the tally shows that the death numbers were not even close. While approximately 374 people were shot and killed with rifles, roughly 656 people were beaten to death with "hands, fists, feet, etc." On September 26, 2016, Breitbart News reported similar gaps between rifle/shotgun homicides and stabbing homicides. FBI's UCR figures showed the number of people killed with rifles and shotguns combined in 2015 was approximately 548. Nearly three times that many approximately 1,573 people were stabbed or hacked to death. This is not to diminish the deaths of those who did die via a rifle. But it does show that the Democrats' relentless focus on banning "assault weapons" is a focus on something that is not used for homicide with anywhere near the frequency of knives and/or fists and feet. Let's protect our kids, but let's get the attention where it's needed most; on the mentally ill and the terrorist.

The **Irish In** America

p until the mid-19th century, most Irish immigrants in America were members of the

Protestant middle class. When the Great Potato Famine hit Ireland in 1845, close to 1 million poor and uneducated Irish Catholics began pouring into America to escape starvation. Despised for their alien religious beliefs and unfamiliar accents by the American Protestant majority, the immigrants had trouble finding even menial jobs. When Irish Americans in the country's cities took to the streets on St. Patrick's Day to celebrate their heritage, newspapers portrayed them in cartoons as drunk, violent monkeys. The American Irish soon began to realize, however, that their large and growing numbers endowed them with a political power that had yet to be exploited. They started to organize, and their voting block, known as the "green machine," became an important swing vote for political hopefuls. Suddenly, annual St. Patrick's Day parades became a show of strength for Irish Americans, as well as a must-attend event for a slew of political candidates. In 1948, President Harry S. Truman attended New York City's St. Patrick's Day parade, a proud moment for the many Irish Americans whose ancestors had to fight stereotypes and racial prejudice to find acceptance

f you need a laugh, or want to laugh your head off, Fort Lauderdale is the place to be this month for comedy in all shapes and sizes. You can catch a Seinfeld-style, one-man show, a zany musical set back in the days of King Solomon, or even an ancient Greek farce written by the "Father of Comedy" himself whose political satire and feminist leanings are as strident and hilarious as anything you'll find on the contemporary stage. So fasten your seat belts, theater-lovers of South Florida, you're in for a wild, funny ride. First up, and last (he's on till March 25th)

is **MY SON THE WAITER: A Jewish Tragedy**, the one-man show written by and starring Brad Zimmerman that's been touring nationally. As the show's title implies, the jokes are typically, selfdeprecatingly Jewish, but the issues (like being a disappointment to one's mother) are universal. Anyone who's been to New York and met waiters/"actors" recognizes the type. But Brad's managed to make lemonade out of his lemons, presenting his life story in a most touching and humorous monologue filled with original server jokes, traditional Catskill-type sexist jokes (so

charmingly delivered, we can forgive their misogyny) and spot-on sports analyses (golf, which involves no running or exertion is NOT a sport!).

This "Jewish fetus" didn't "become viable when he graduated from medical school" but rather, at the age of 42, finally found his calling as a stand-up comic. He was a popular opener for Joan Rivers and George Carlin, back in the day, and his one-man show comes fresh off a successful, 15-month, Off-Broadway run. See Brad run down his life and emerge victorious at NSU Art Museum's Horvitz Auditorium, One E. Las Olas Blvd., Ft. Lauderdale 33301. Tickets at mysonthewaiter.com or call 1-855-HIT-SHOW.

For comedy of biblical proportions, there's no need to brush up on the Old Testament (who knew the Book of Kings could be so funny!) when you can simply attend the royal

court at Ft. Lauderdale's newly gilded Empire Stage. Where you'll bear witness to creative dynamo Ginger Reiter's latest, most delightfully funny (and at times historically accurate) musical comedy sensation: **KING SOLOMON & HIS 700 WIVES**.

The show stars Reiter's famous comedienne daughter, Sheba Mason, playing the Queen of Sheba (who else?), Joseph Long as her First Minister, Empire's owner (and owning the part) David R. Gordon as King Solomon, Ann Marie Olson as his golden-voiced, guilt-tripping mom, Bathsheba, and the impressive vocals of Mike Dinwiddle as Hiram, King of Tyre. And because there's no way little Empire -- or any stage for that matter -can fit in 700 wives, we're blessed with the best harem dancers of the lot in Samantha Laney (also great vocals), Kitchy Celestina (an MTV dance competition winner whose belly is art in motion), Cara Hollich-Boll, and the many faces of transvestwife-wannabe Brian

Bloomer who, when not gyrating with the girls, morphs into a messenger or Menelik, the Bar-Mitzvah boy. Above it all, Cantor Manny Silver channels Rodney Dangerfield as the disembodied voice of G-d who "gets no respect." Heavily peppered with iconic/ironic words of wisdom, the play also features lacerating political satire. Like when Solomon decides to trim his labor budget by announcing: "We will use foreign slaves from one of the shithole countries to build the Temple." Old film clips of historic battle scenes culminate in a shot of "Yul Brenner and his army from the East." And among the screenings of classic biblical paintings, there's the lineup of "False Idols" where stone and clay figurines are followed by a fancy car and football heroes that will leave you laughing so hard, you'll be falling off your seat.

Reiter's original musical numbers (21 in all) feature orchestrations by Ike Reeves and Kurt Walter with choreography by Nikki Allred Boyd. They include such gems as "Just Marry The Girls" to assuage a pharaoh's anger at "shtupping" his daughter, "Something is Better Than Nothing" for practical business advice, and popular proverbs such as "From dust we come..." that concludes with "There's nothing new under the sun." To which I say: It ain't necessarily so. King Solomon & His 700 Wives is as shiny and new a musical as you'll see all year!

Transitioning from a highly successful 2017 femaleoriented season (two Best Theater awards, a Best Actress and six Carbonell nominations), Thinking Cap Theatre (TCT) at The Vanguard is launching 2018 with yet one more feminist play. **WOMEN IN ASSEMBLY** by Aristophanes won first prize when first performed in Athens at the Festival of Dionysus in 393 BCE. The great comedic playwright's script remains so rich in social and political satire -- not to mention salacious and irreverent content (including the first instance of scatological humor) -- it might just as easily have been written today. Ingeniously reconstructed by director and TCT founder Nicole Stodard, Women in Assembly augurs more accolades for this year's "Back to the Future" series of classical and classically inspired performances.

Upon entering the theater, we're immediately struck by a scene that's both evocative of ancient Greece and totally original. Blue Man Group-like mannequins are posed among modern "columns" framing a blast-tothe-past video presentation that transports us through space and time. This preshow entertainment includes depictions of urn-art athletes running in short togas, Greek cartoons, and even a live webcam of our actors in their dressing room. All accompanied by lively pop music. Set designer/scenic artist Alyiece Moretto-Watkins made the most of The Vanguard's expansive performance space by including backstage areas in her creative, multifaceted set.

Musical director Patrick Watkins executed the sounds and rousing hit songs to which the "Greek chorus" both sing and dance throughout the show. Of special note is Noah Levine's striking, rubber-bodied antics as "Manniquin." He also portrays salivated-over heartthrob Epigionies in a hyperactive comedy routine that, once again, cements his standing as a popular TCT company member.

Sabrina Lynn Gore, another local favorite celebrated for her vocal and acting range, knocks it out of the park in her triple roles as Woman Four, Chorus Leader and Town Crieress. And a big welcome back to Sally Bondi who never shied away from playing ugly women: she makes a dynamite Old Hag. Speaking of older players, one can't help but admire the comedic chops of stage veterans Michael Gioia and Jim Gibbons who ranted their manly displeasure while wearing ridiculously short, women's shifts -- and heels -- without a slip up (literally and figuratively).

As for plot, Women in Assembly is a laugh-a-minute, role-reversal riot. A group of women dress as men in order to attend the "assembly"/congress in Athens, take over, and immediately establish a communal form of government where all goods, food, even lovers and children, are equally shared. The women take action because the men keep changing their minds and nothing gets done (sound familiar?). A motion to hand over the reins to the fairer sex is passed because "it's the only thing we've never tried." In this female utopia, the law of Sex on Demand means "uglies" must get satisfaction first. Predicting the elimination of crime (there would be no need), their leader Praxagora (Casey Dressler) declares: "I'll soon convert the law courts into food courts." And so on.

Prepare to be astonished, entertained, and gobsmacked by how much ancient Greek life mirrors our times. Women in Assembly, a not-to-be-missed comedy with music, is playing at The Vanguard, 1501 S. St. Patrick's Day Traditions

Get the real story about this beloved Irish holiday and the patron saint it's named after. St. Patrick's Day is celebrated annually on March 17, the anniversary of his death in the fifth century.

The Irish have observed this day as a religious holiday for over 1,000 years. On St. Patrick's Day, which falls during the Christian season of Lent, Irish families would traditionally attend church in the morning and celebrate in the afternoon. Lenten prohibitions against the consumption of meat were waived and people would dance, drink and feast–on the traditional meal of Irish bacon and cabbage.

ST. PATRICK'S DEATH AND THE FIRST ST. PATRICK'S DAY PARADE

Saint Patrick, who lived during the fifth century, is the patron saint and national apostle of Ireland. Born in Roman Britain, he was kidnapped and brought to Ireland as a slave at the age of 16. He later escaped, but returned to Ireland and was credited with bringing Christianity to its people. In the centuries following Patrick's death (believed to have been on March 17, 461), the mythology surrounding his life became ever more ingrained in the Irish culture: Perhaps the most well known legend is that he explained the Holy Trinity (Father, Son and Holy Spirit) using the three leaves of a native Irish clover, the shamrock.

Since around the ninth or 10th century, people in Ireland have been observing the Roman Catholic feast day of St. Patrick on March 17. Interestingly, however, the first parade held to honor St. Patrick's Day took place not in Ireland but in the United States. On March 17, 1762, Irish soldiers serving in the English military marched through New York City. Along with their music, the parade helped the soldiers reconnect with their Irish roots, as well as with fellow Irishmen serving in the English army. Did You Know? More than 100 St. Patrick's Day parades are held across the United States; New York City and Boston are home to the largest celebrations. **GROWTH OF ST. PATRICK'S DAY CELEBRATIONS**

Over the next 35 years, Irish patriotism among American immigrants flourished, prompting the rise of so-called "Irish Aid" societies like the Friendly Sons of Saint Patrick and the Hibernian Society. Each group would hold annual parades featuring bagpipes (which actually first became popular in the Scottish and British armies) and drums. In 1848, several New York Irish Aid societies decided to unite their parades to form one official New York City St. Patrick's Day Parade. Today, that parade is the world's oldest civilian parade and the largest in the United States, with over 150,000 participants. Each year, nearly 3 million people line the 1.5-mile parade route to watch the procession, which takes more than five hours. Boston, Chicago, Philadelphia and Savannah also celebrate the day with parades involving between 10,000 and 20,000 participants each.

THE CHICAGO RIVER DYED GREEN ON ST. PATRICK'S DAY

As Irish immigrants spread out over the United States, other cities developed their own traditions. One of these is Chicago's annual dyeing of the Chicago River green. The practice started in 1962, when city pollution-control workers used dyes to trace illegal sewage discharges and realized that the green dye might provide a unique way to celebrate the holiday. That year, they released 100 pounds of green vegetable dye into the river-enough to keep it green for a week! Today, in order to minimize environmental damage, only 40 pounds of dye are used, and the river turns green for only several hours. Although Chicago historians claim their city's idea for a river of green was original, some natives of Savannah, GA (whose St. Patrick's Day parade, the oldest in the nation, dates back to 1813) believe



the idea originated in their town. They point out that, in 1961, a hotel restaurant manager named Tom Woolley convinced city officials to dye Savannah's river green. The experiment didn't exactly work as planned, and the water only took on a slight greenish hue. Savannah never attempted to dye its river again, but Woolley maintains (though others refute the claim) that he personally suggested the idea to Chicago's Mayor Richard J. Daley.

ST. PATRICK'S DAY CELEBRATIONS AROUND THE WORLD

Today, people of all backgrounds celebrate St. Patrick's Day, especially throughout the United States, Canada and Australia. Although North America is home to the largest productions, St. Patrick's Day is celebrated in many other locations far from Ireland, including Japan, Singapore and Russia. In modern-day Ireland, St. Patrick's Day was traditionally been a religious occasion. In fact, up until the 1970s, Irish laws mandated that pubs be closed on March 17. Beginning in 1995, however, the Irish government began a national campaign to use interest in St. Patrick's Day to drive tourism and showcase Ireland and Irish culture to the rest of the world. Today, approximately 1 million people annually take part in Ireland's St. Patrick's Festival in Dublin, a multi-day celebration featuring parades, concerts, outdoor theater productions and fireworks shows.

investor and naturalist, who deeded 180-acres of his hidden paradise to the State of Florida in 1941.

Denyse will also share some details about the Bachelor's Rose Ceremony, which was filmed at Bonnet House and aired on January 29, 2018.

Having previously served as the Curator at Bonnet House Museum & Gardens from 1996 to 2002,

Denyse Cunningham returned in 2014 to oversee the restoration and preservation of the beautiful 35acre estate in Fort Lauderdale.
